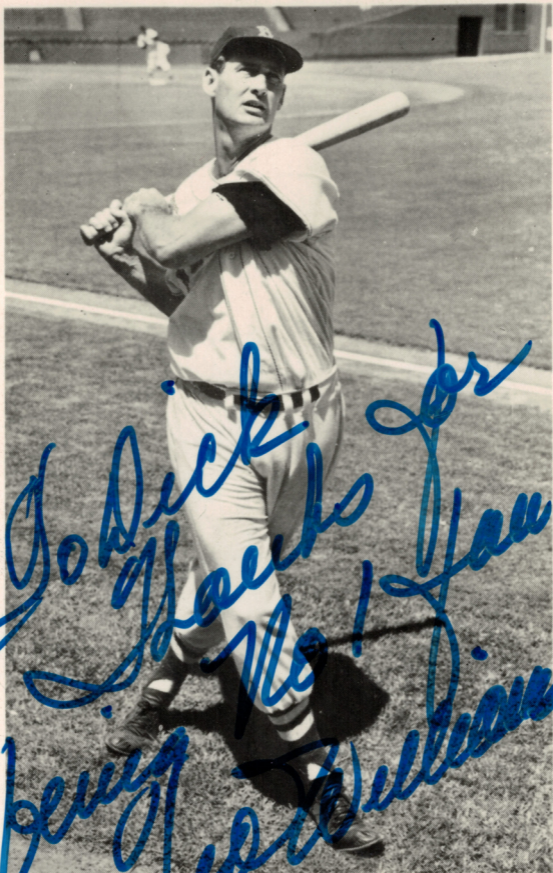

I know you think me a hell of a guy I plead guilty on some counts, I should have written you long ago, but possibly the delay might help in negotiations etc, I am truly sorry as I know what means to wait and expect an answer etc.

But Stevey you know that I would let no one else other than you do a book and me will exact every recompense possible.

I have had two or three communications from Putnam's and haven't answered but am today, telling them I will cooperate and that you are the one that I would do this for, I have had letters from Harcourt & Brace

I believe it is also some other Company also for moving pictures, I would not do this because would not be able to control subjects etc. those jews are tough and develop some sensational angles to ones discredit.

The book am in no way anxious but will do it, I would like it if right and that would have to be our aim, I do feel there has

been lots of garbled things not true that has been written, some downright rotten and damaging, also plagiarism practiced, old rehash stuff that was wrong in first story written and merely slapped together and put out in story or book form, I would like as I said to have something done that would clear up such as coming officially from me.

You take the preacher thing of my early days in Rayston and getting first try out in Augusta, Ga. all was untrue, the fights only two all from hazing etc, some fellow by name of Scher or ~~the~~ Scully got out a book that in libraries or schools printed by some cheap firm, Messner I believe, Jews I suppose, that was a disgrace, they must have rushed it out to benefit from Life stories I did, for think am sure this book came out in 1952, I have not read this book through but expect to, I was so inflamed by a few paragraphs I could not go through it. One I saw

was that my mother was half Indian, which I hasten to add is certainly no disgrace but it plants an idea in readers mind as the average person thinks of Indians in general are uneducated, poor and live slovenly etc.

Try and get this book read it and keep for future reference our book.

We should get benefit from every angle in negotiations that we can, for instance syndicate after book is out etc.

I have worlds of clippings for references also most all the books that's been done by others, that we can dig out the true to use also the untrue to correct, we can do a book that's right & cover everything from boy head up to now, there are several subjects that no one has used etc.

not less than $\$150,000$ the income
to pay for $\frac{3}{4}$ or $\frac{2}{3}$ of tuition
tuition & expense, the balance to be
earned by effort or secured, this
for the earnest and real deserving
ones, the selection is by a board
of three who have already accepted,
Dr. Herman Caldwell head of all
higher educational institutions of
Georgia formerly Pres. University of
Georgia, Dr. Elkin an eminent
man in Atlanta, high or at top
of Emory college, Atlanta, then
a lawyer friend of mine in
Royston, Ga. I have put aside
all fees I have earned for 2 years

magazine did so well on the stories



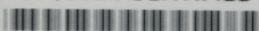

Hope you luck in your work also with kindest regards. I am,



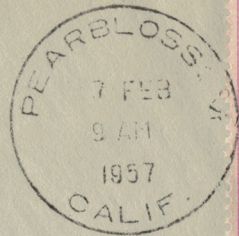
